Scoring	What operating period will the projects be scored on?	Although for NOFA 2016, the data period was for the federal prior fiscal year October – September, the 2017 local process will look at data for the most recent calendar year. HMIS data for this operating period will generate an APR. Year to date expenditure data will be drawn from LOCCS from the onset of the most recent operating year through Dec. 31, 2016. The expected amount of drawdown will be adjusted by the number of months expired during the operating year.	Response complete.

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Scoring	When can I get copies of the custom reports (like the System Framework Project Level report) needed to complete the tools?	Agencies can generate an APR (0625) fro calendar year 2016 for their own use if desired in order to estimate their score. Specialty reports will be made available as soon as the tools are finalized. As a matter of best practice, agencies are encouraged to routinely validate HMIS data which supports high data quality and consistency.	Response complete.
