All projects are subject to review and scoring. Projects listed on the GIW for the first time cannot be reallocated.	
Project Types	Renewal Projects: Permanent Supportive Housing, Rapid Rehousing, Transitional Housing, Safe Haven, Homeless Management of Information System (HMIS); Youth Homelessness Demonstration Projects (YHDP) Renewal Projects, YHDP Replacement Projects; SSO-CES; and Joint (RRH+TH). System Mandates	HMIS, Coordinated Entry System (CES), Housing First and Low Barrier housing approaches, RTFH Written Standards, VAWA, and regulatory assurances.	
Forms requirements – Intent Forms and Standard Assurances	Forms are required prior to accessing the application in e-Snaps.
