

## 2022 CoC Supplemental Competition to Address Unsheltered and Rural Homelessness Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO)

## Introduction

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has released a Special NOFO to Address Unsheltered and Rural Homelessness (Special NOFO) to target efforts to reduce unsheltered homelessness, particularly in communities with very high levels of unsheltered homelessness and homelessness in rural areas. Through this Special NOFO, HUD will award funding to communities to implement coordinated approaches -- grounded in Housing First and public health principles -- to reduce the prevalence of unsheltered homelessness, and improve services engagement, health outcomes, and housing stability among highly vulnerable unsheltered individuals and families. The Supplemental Competition to Address Unsheltered and Rural Homelessness for 2022 was released on June 22, 2022. This document provides a summary of critical information and highlights for this Supplemental Competition.
