

Homeless Housing Assistance and Prevention Program Notification of Awards

The State of California Homeless Coordinating and Financing Council (HCFC) announced the availability of <u>Homeless Housing</u>, <u>Assistance and Prevention Program (HHAP</u>) grant funding. HHAP is a \$650 million block grant program designed to support regional coordination and expand or develop local capacity to address immediate homelessness challenges throughout the state. HHAP is authorized by AB 101 (Committee on Budget, Chapter 159, Statues of 2019), which was signed into law by Governor Gavin Newsom on July 31, 2019. The San Diego City and County Continuum of Care (CoC) was awarded \$10,790,528.04

On November 13, 2020, HCFC announced the availability of an additional \$300 million in <u>HHAP Round 2</u> grant funding. The second round of HHAP funding was authorized by AB83 (Committee on Budget, Chapter 15, Statues of 2020) and was signed into law by Governor Gavin Newsom on June 29, 2020. The San Diego City and County CoC was awarded \$5,105,688.00.

The Regional Task Force on Homelessness (RTFH), as the Lead Agency for the San Diego CoC, is the administrative entity of the HHAP Round 1 and Round 2 funding. The CoC Advisory Board agreed to combine the HHAP Round 1 and Round 2 funding and that approximately \$3 million of HHAP funding be awarded to current Homeless Emergency Aid Program (HEAP) grantees. RTFH identified HEAP funding priorities based on the City of San Diego's Community Action Plan on Homelessness, the San Diego County Coordinated Community Plan to End Youth Homelessness, feedback from HEAP grantees, and community engagement with cities and regional groups. The HEAP funded priorities identified were: street outreach, diversion, safe parking lots, client flex funds, and SOAR (SSI/SSDI, Advocacy and Referrals). HEAP grantees were asked to submit HHAP Letters of Interest by April 30, 2021 and on May 13, 2021 RTFH announced letters of commitment.

RTFH has awarded 19 contracts, totaling **\$3,638,680.44** in HHAP funding. HHAP funding requires at least 8% of the total HHAP funding allocation be dedicated to youth specific programs. RTFH has awarded **\$474,792.10** of this initial round of HHAP funding toward youth specific programs. RTHF has notified the HHAP grantees of the award amounts, which will be effective from June 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022.
